

Homily for the Feast of

The Immaculate Conception

It is the time of year we wait and watch. It is the time we learn to be prepared for the coming of God into our lives. But there is a flip side to waiting and watching. And that flip side asks this question: what do you do when you actually encounter God in your life and you are asked to respond? To put it another way: what happens when the waiting is over?

The answer to that question lies in today's Feast. For in this Feast we honor Mary who was able to respond completely. We celebrate Mary's capacity to be unafraid to abandon the plans of her life in order to accept the invitation from God to live differently. With no promise of happiness and with no blueprint for the future, Mary responds to God by saying: "Let it be done according to Your will."
